

SNOQUALMIE INDIAN TRIBE - CULTURAL RESOURCES MONITOR

The Snoqualmie Indian Tribe is seeking applicants for a contract position with the Tribe to serve as the Tribe's Cultural Resource Monitor. The person selected will represent the Tribe during ground disturbing activities in the Tribe's Usual and Accustomed Area.

PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES

Serve as cultural resources monitor for projects involving archaeological resources, historic properties, and tribal resources; monitor activities associated with construction operations for archaeological and historical resource protection.

Work with archaeological firms hired by project proponents to insure protection of cultural resources.

Selected individual will enter into an "on-call" contractual agreement with the Snoqualmie Tribe and be responsible for reporting activities, hours worked and any issues related to the project to the Tribe.

Anticipated pay range is \$15.00 to \$18.00 per hour. Hours and work load will vary with each project.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

- Degree in archaeology, anthropology, or closely-related field; or equivalent training in archaeological research or cultural resources management; field experience in Pacific Northwest is essential.
- Experience or familiarity with the National Historic Preservation Act Section 106 process and state/federal historic preservation laws is beneficial.
- Applicants must be comfortable working with MS Word, MS Excel, and other standard business software, and must be able to quickly learn new software as necessary
- Applicants must have own transportation and be willing to travel to job locations.
- Experience or familiarity of the cultural/historic resources aspects of NHPA, NEPA, SEPA, and other environmental laws.

Preference in hiring for this position shall be given to the following persons in the following enumerated order: (1) Members of the Snoqualmie Indian Tribe; (2) Indian spouses of members of the Snoqualmie Indian Tribe who contribute to the support of a Snoqualmie household; (3) Other Indians; (4) Non-Indians.
